Peer Support

Peer support is a service where people with the lived experience of substance use disorder and/or mental illness provide support to their peers. Peer support can be accessed in a variety of settings including hospitals, treatment centers, and community-based organizations. Certified Peer Recovery Supporters can also have lived experience of mental illness, homelessness, domestic violence, etc.



Recovery Community Organizations

Recovery Housing

Recovery housing is a supportive housing environment that provides a safe, sober place for people in recovery from substance use disorders to live and access recovery programming. Harm Reduction

Harm reduction services are an available option for people in crisis who may or may not be seeking long term recovery. Harm reduction can include things like needle exchange programs, fentanyl test strips, overdose reversal drugs and more. Other spaces that may offer free naloxone in your community may include libraries, police stations, public health departments, ADAMH/ MHRB, recovery community, etc.
